The Kidneys- How They Perform

The kidneys are very essential to our health. They are small but they are powerful and very necessary to our wellbeing. The kidneys are chemical factories that work all the time to remove waste and keep our blood pressure in check. If your kidneys stop working so will you.

Here are the top jobs that healthy kidneys perform.

They remove waste for the body- The kidneys are like our body's filter. They prevent a buildup of wastes in the body.

They regulate your blood pressure-A healthy kidney produces a hormone called aldosterone to cause your blood vessels to constrict thereby enabling your body to control your blood pressure. Kidneys can also cause your blood pressure to go higher if it seems too low or try to lower the pressure if it seems too high.

They kidneys control production of red blood cells- Your kidneys produce a hormone called erythropoietin which tells the bone marrow to make red blood cells. Red blood cells are important because they carry oxygen from your lungs to supply all the oxygen your body needs. This is how you get your energy that you need to function.

Kidneys produce an active form of vitamin D- Vitamin D is necessary for healthy bones and it comes from two sources in people: absorption from food or vitamin pills and exposure to sun's ultraviolet B radiation. The vitamin D from these two sources is then converted by the kidneys to the active form of vitamin D that is needed by your body for healthy bones.

Kidneys control pH levels- Your kidneys work to maintain a healthy balance of chemicals that control acid levels. pH is a measure of acid and base. When cells break down, they make an acid in your body. Your kidneys function to balance the pH of your body by either removing or adjusting the amounts of acid and buffering agents in your body.

As you can see these two small organs are extremely important in keeping your body healthy and in good balance.

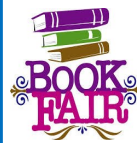
Why Do Catholics Do That: Lenten Gospel Acclamation instead of the Alleluia? At the beginning of Lent, our Gospel Acclamation before the reading of the Gospel changed. During Lent, we find ourselves longing for and preparing for the celebration of Jesus's Resurrection from the dead. For now, we are in the desert, the wilderness, longing for rest, fulfillment, and the land promised to us by God. We thirst for the joy and hope of Resurrection, "like a weary land where there is no water." In that spirit of longing, we set aside the "Alleluia," a word which means "Praise God," in favor of a substitute to punctuate the spirit of Lent. The purpose of this Lenten Gospel Acclamation (and the Acclamation other times) is to prepare our hearts to receive the Word of God in the Gospel. The verse that accompanies the Acclamation is normally a summary of the Gospel reading itself, a sort of sneak-peak. Our Gospel this Sunday recounts the beautiful story of the blind man who is healed by Jesus, who comes to know as he talks to the Pharisees who Jesus really is: the promised one, the light of the world. May we long after Jesus the light as we journey together through
