## From the Desk of our Pastor

#1: *And with your spirit*

One of the most noticeable changes in the new translation of the Roman Missal is the response to the greeting, "The Lord be with you." The new response is, "And with your spirit." This is a precise translation of the Latin phrase, "*Et cum spiritu tuo.*" Saint Paul is the first to greet Christians, "The Lord be with your spirit!" Early in the development of the Sacred Liturgy, Saint Hippolytus gives witness to this greeting of Saint Paul becoming an integral part of Christian worship. As early as the third century, Christians greeted the bishop or priest with the dialogue, "The Lord be with you . . . And with your spirit." With the revised English translation of the Roman Missal, we will once again take upon our lips the liturgical dialogue that has been in place for most of the life of the Church.

A profound significance in the meaning of this greeting cannot escape us: the new response acknowledges the unique role of the priest celebrant whose spirit has been anointed by the Holy Spirit and whose soul has been conformed to Jesus the High Priest. The priest, taken from among the Christian faithful and called to act *in persona Christi*, stands in the place of Christ whenever he celebrates the Sacraments of the Church. As "another Christ", God works through the priest to make present the salvation won for us by the Lord's passion, death, and resurrection. In the end, each time we use this dialogue, the Church is reminding us to open our eyes of faith and see that God is working through human instruments to give us divine gifts.

## PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY

“As I have loved you, so also should you love one another. This is how all will know you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.” John 13: 34-35

### Does my Loved One have Alzheimer's or Another Dementia?

Not every person with memory loss problems has Alzheimer's disease. Alzheimer's actually is just one cause of dementia. What is Dementia? It is the loss of mental functions – such as memory, reasoning and thinking – that is severe enough to interfere with a person's daily functioning. Dementia is not a disease in itself but rather it is a group of symptoms that are caused by various conditions and diseases. Some of the common symptoms include changes in behavior, mood and personality. There are more than 50 conditions that can cause or mimic the symptoms of dementia. A small percentage of dementias can be reversed when the underlying problem is treated such as vitamin B12 deficiency or underactive thyroid. In some cases it may appear to be dementia while a severe depression is really causing the symptoms.

Dementia develops when parts of brain that are involved with language, learning, decision-making, and memory are affected by one or more types of diseases or infections. Some of these causes include;

- Diseases that cause degeneration or loss of nerve cells in brain such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's and Huntington's.
- Head injury-either a single severe injury or longer smaller injuries
- Disease that affect blood vessels, such as stroke,
- Illness such as kidney, liver and lung disease
- Certain types of hydrocephalus, an accumulation of fluid in the brain that can result from developmental abnormalities, infections, injuries or brain tumors
- Toxic reactions such as excessive alcohol or drug use
- Nutritional deficiencies, such as vitamin B12 and folate deficiency

Alzheimer's disease causes 50% to 60% of all dementias. It is the most common cause of dementia.

Dementia is considered to be a late-life disease because it tends to develop mainly in elderly people. Approximately 5% to 8% of all people over age 65 have some form of dementia. This number doubles every 5 years above 65. It is estimated that up to 50% of people in their 80's will have some form of dementia. Because some causes of dementia can be cured or partially treated, it is important to get the right diagnosis and to learn what your options for care are. Next week, I will discuss Alzheimer's disease.

Tickets are \$1.00 each. We ask for your continued support and apologize for any inconvenience.

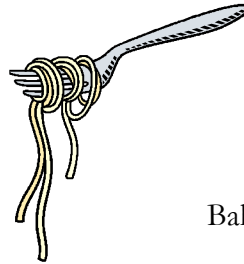
