#### THYROID AWARENESS MONTH

“It’s January; do you know where your thyroid is?” This is the tag line for Thyroid Awareness Month and at least 30 million Americans have thyroid disease. Some experts believe that number is more like 59 million. Unfortunately, many don’t even know they have the disease, haven’t been diagnosed yet or aren’t being properly managed by their care provider.

The thyroid is a small butterfly shaped gland located in the lower part of your neck. It secretes hormones and is your master gland for metabolism and energy. It provides every cell in the body with energy. If the thyroid isn’t working properly, you can experience many problems including weight gain or inability to lose weight, fatigue, high cholesterol, depression, problems with menstrual cycle, infertility, menopausal issues, hair loss, and sleep related problems to name a few. Because the symptoms of thyroid disease are so common, it is often misdiagnosed or overlooked. It has been incorrectly diagnosed as depression especially in women. Thyroid disease is seven times more likely to affect women. You should be aware that doctors often don’t include a thyroid test when they do annual physicals or order regular blood work, so don’t assume that your doctor is routinely checking for this condition. There are numerous diseases that can be caused by abnormalities in the thyroid. These include: hypothyroidism, hyperthyroidism, goiter, thyroid cancer and thyroiditis.

Through an in-depth reflection on the Scriptures, the Theology of the Body addresses the two most fundamental and universal questions: 1) "What does it mean to be human?" and 2) "How do I live my life in a way that brings true happiness and fulfillment?" Therefore, this is a rich, refined understanding of our Catholic Faith and ultimately a re-discovery of the very meaning and purpose of life.
